General Proposal

What is the Arkansas Opioid Recovery Partnership?

Arkansas received master settlement funding from the National Prescription Opiate Litigation. The settlement funding will be split evenly between Arkansas cities, counties, and the state. The cities (represented by the Arkansas Municipal League) and the counties (represented by the Association of Arkansas Counties) came together to create the Arkansas Opioid Recovery Partnership to fund opioid prevention, treatment, and recovery projects to abate the opioid epidemic.

What are the general proposal funding requirements?

The funding is intended for the creation or expansion of opioid prevention, treatment, and recovery projects. The money is **not** meant to replace or supplant existing funding. Exhibit E, found at www.arorp.org/funding-opportunities/, specifies exactly how settlement funds must be used. The ARORP Advisory Board will use Exhibit E guidelines to evaluate your proposal.

What kinds of projects will be accepted?

The general proposal allows flexibility for you to build-your-own proposal; you can submit any project related to opioid prevention, treatment, and recovery. We want you to assess your community's needs and propose a solution to address existing gaps in services.

What do you need to include in the general proposal?

You must fill out an online application at www.arorp.org/funding-opportunities. You do not need to hire a grant writer. Feel free to insert your email into the application to log on and look around; we will not receive any information that you type into the application until you are ready to submit. There is no deadline for the general proposal, so please take your time with your application.

You will need to include:

- Approval signatures from mayor(s) and county judge(s) in your jurisdiction. There is a downloadable approval signature page at www.arorp.org/fundingopportunities/.
- A detailed, line-item budget for your work. Be prepared to explain where every dollar will go.
- A data-driven explanation of your community's need for the program
- A thorough, but brief, explanation of what you hope to accomplish
