
THE ARKANSAS NALOXONE PROJECT

Current Opioid Statistics

- Number of overdose deaths nationally to 107,622
- Over 932,000 have died from a drug overdose from 1999 to 2020
- Opioid epidemic has cost the U.S. economy
 2.5 trillion dollars over the last 4 years
- Arkansas overdose death rate for 2021 is 20.52 per every 100,000 Arkansans
- Arkansas is the 2nd highest opioid prescribing state





Joshua Ashley-Pauley Act (2015)

PROTECTS BYSTANDERS WHO CALL 911 FOR AN OVERDOSE

20-13 1604 Opioid Antagonist Immunity ACT 1222 (2015)

Doctors can prescribe naloxone to first responders

Bystanders and first responders can administer naloxone with liability

Act 284 (2017)

Anyone can purchase naloxone from their pharmacist without a prescription


- Branded naloxone without insurance costs \$138
- Generic naloxone without insurance costs \$98.49

Naloxone Bank

- ARORP has purchased \$500,000 dollars worth of naloxone to establish the Arkansas Naloxone Bank.
- When organizations are awarded HERO funding, they receive a credit for the Arkansas Naloxone Bank.
- Organizations will be trained to use their credit, allowing them to order naloxone

Restrictions

Naloxone received through this program cannot be sold or disbursed to harm reduction programs for redistribution. First responders, who are eligible to receive naloxone plus training from the program provided by the University of Arkansas Criminal Justice Institute, are **not** eligible to apply for this program.

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
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Arkansas Opioid Recovery Partnership Proposal for Naloxone Community Hero Proposal
