Reason for Discharge

- Admin (3)
 - One resident needed clinical services. We contacted our Faith based treatment providers; we explained that the individual needed a higher level of care that Next Step was unable to provide. SOZO treatment center took the resident with no hesitation. Safe Haven Women's treatment center allowed their Peer Support Specialist, who assisted in the placement of the individual, to transport the resident to SOZO treatment center. The resident was making both homicidal and suicidal statements while neglecting hygiene and not bathing. All of which are warning signs of immediate needs. Our three agencies worked together to get the services needed. The resident has since contacted our team and reports being in a happier and healthier mental state.
 - o Two residents were required to leave due to theft.

 All 26 residents are in regular communication with their spouses/children and working towards the goal of reunification.

Sobriety

• Four men have over a year of sustained recovery and working on their 18-month birthdays. •

The remaining 22 have a range of 3-9 months of recovery.

• 2 have maintained sobriety since leaving NSRH.

- 8 have obtained their driver's license since entering NSRH.
- 5 had a driver's license upon entering program.
- 4 have their own vehicles.
- 2 have their own homes upon exiting the program.

Services Provided

Next Step has expanded our drug and alcohol program into three phases. A unique combination of both clinical and non clinical services, creating an atmosphere of a holistic approach to long term recovery. This three-tiered phase system is 10 months in length. However, residents are permitted to stay until they are ready to take their "Next Step".

We have partnered with Safe Haven Treatment to provide our clinical services.

Phase I - consist of 12 weeks of Intensive Outpatient Treatment (IOP). Upon completion, residents are eligible for weekend passes on the first and third weekend of each month.

Phase II - consists of 12 weeks of Outpatient (OP) drug and alcohol treatment with a reduced requirement of class time.

Phase III - is 4 months of aftercare, where participants maintain their progress.

Upon completing our ten-month program, we host a graduation where residents have family and friends celebrate their achievements with our staff and recovery community. They are also given the opportunity to continue living at Next Step as alumni; this is the truest form of peer recovery leadership.
