	On May 15, 2023, HSPD hired peer in training, Carrie Montgomery, to fill the role of the peer specialist for the ORT.
	The previous peer specialist built a recovery support program, but PRS Montgomery started right away at making new connections, continuing the existing ones in our community and beyond, and finding new way to build the program.
	PRS Montgomery developed 2 new brochures to hand out to educate our community about opioids, what the ORT is, and how a peer specialist can help individuals and different organizations.

1) Please discuss your milestones completed this quarter

PRS Montgomery was the keynote speaker at 4 events in the month of September. Her story has proven to be an inspiration to the community who poured so much into her when she needed it the most. She and the Community Police Response Team were speakers at Red Ribbon Week at Lakeside Junior and High School in October. ORT had several hundred contacts between trainings, community events, and speaking engagements.

ORT started a new program called Operation Recovery. The community of Hot Springs donated both items and money to purchase care items for people in drug rehabilitation programs. The first place the ORT visited was a ladies' facility that was housing 36 women and 11 children. The program was a success and will continue.

PRS Montgomery has been on the Circuit Court Drug Court staffing team for 3 years now. She continues that relationship as one of their peer recovery specialists. She also assists with district court specialty courts as needed.

PRS Montgomery teaches a program in the Garland County Detention Center called Getting Ahead While Getting Out. She helps the participants investigate their lives and situations and helps them to understand all the different resources in their lives that can be affected. If any of the resources in their lives are lacking, they are in some sort of poverty. This program teaches them how to rejoin the middle class and how to make a plan and goals to keep from being a victim of their circumstances and recidivism.

ORT responded to 7 non-fatal overdoses. Of those 7 victims, PRS Montgomery helped 3 of them to either enter treatment of connect with mental health providers that fit their needs. An open line of communication was established with 5 of them.

PRS Montgomery received another 25 referrals for recovery support. Of those 25, she successfully helped 10 of them enter rehabilitation services. Another 8 of them were connected with mental health providers.

On October 14, ORT hosted our 3rd annual Kicking the Stigma Kickball tournament. This is a tournament between first responders and the recovery community. It allows them to meet each other in a more mutual setting where both groups have met each other in a not so favorable of times. This is event always a great a success. It will continue.

	There were 18 referrals to PRS. She successfully helped 10 of them either enter rehabilitation services or connected them with mental health providers. Several of those referrals came from probation and parole.
