Description of Milestones

- 1) Please discuss your milestones completed this quarter. Include a brief description of progress made on all milestones. Include dates items were completed.

In each of the 20 cases this quarter, the peer support worked diligently to provide initial and ongoing support to victims and/or their families.

In one case, a 32-year-old female overdosed on fentanyl supplied by a dealer. The peer support provided her with an overdose response kit and facilitated entry into a recovery program through Union Rescue Mission - Dorcas House.

In another case, a 32-year-old male was revived after receiving two doses of naloxone and transported to a nearby hospital. Initially, he attributed his condition to heat exhaustion but later admitted to methamphetamine use. The peer support provided him with an overdose response kit and ensured that additional treatment options were being made available through the hospital.

A third case involved a 32-year-old male who was found unresponsive and revived after receiving two doses of naloxone. After regaining consciousness, both he and his girlfriend admitted to using fentanyl. The peer support provided overdose response kits to both individuals and facilitated their enrollment in treatment with True Self Recovery.

Engagement from the peer support often continued well beyond the initial incident. For example, a 32-year-old male who had overdosed on fentanyl in March continued using narcotics despite previous intervention efforts. In August, the ORT observed a social media post from the same individual requesting help. This time, the peer support successfully facilitated treatment at Serenity Park and is continuing to collaborate with the victim's family to secure ongoing care through additional rehabilitation programs.

In some instances, direct contact with the victim was not possible. When that occurred, the peer support extended assistance to the victim's family. One such case involved an overdose victim who was unfortunately found deceased. The peer support was able to connect the family with Hope Movement for grief support. In another case, a 58-year-old female intentionally overdosed on prescribed Ambien. The peer support was unable to engage directly with her as she was actively receiving medical care. In the meantime, the peer support worked closely with her family, providing an overdose response kit and outlining available treatment and recovery resources.

These highlighted examples represent only a portion of the 20 overdose responses handled by the ORT this quarter. Each of these cases were unique and required specialized attention. This vital and life-saving work performed by the ORT would not be possible without the continued support and opportunities provided through ARORP.

As this quarter marks the completion of Year 1, the ORT remains steadfast in its mission entering Year 2. The continued goal of the ORT is to investigate leads, hold accountable those who are endangering others with illegal narcotics, provide compassionate assistance to individuals in crisis.
